QUARTERLY HIGHLIGHTS

The Matrix ESG-Dividend Income (ESG-DI) portfolio modestly trailed the Russell 1000 Value Index in the 4th quarter but outperformed the benchmark (net of fees) for the 12 months and since inception on 6/30/2021.

In the 4th quarter, four holdings raised their dividends by an average of 7.8% For the year, 21 of 25 holdings (84%) raised their dividends by an average of 6.8%. At year-end, the portfolio had a 3.1% dividend yield, which compares favorably with the 1.76% yield on the S&P 500 and the 2.32% yield on the Russell 1000 Value:

We have gradually been moving from a very defensive posture to a more offensive-oriented stance in our recent portfolio stock selections, with the goal to continue to defend well in a difficult market environment while preparing for better stock market returns in upcoming periods.

At the end of Q4, 2022, the ESG-DI portfolio's largest sector concentrations were consistent with the previous quarter: Financials, Health Care, and Information Technology. We believe these exposures deliver an attractive mix of economic sensitivity, defensiveness, and growth potential. Our estimate of the average upside potential for the portfolio at year-end was well above its historical average, which generally has been bullish for the portfolio and the market in general.

We believe that the portfolio's results in 2022 and since inception demonstrate that the strategy works and that the strategy is well positioned to navigate the current uncertainty, but participate in the eventual market recovery.

The Matrix ESG Dividend Income Composite contains fully discretionary dividend income equity accounts that invest in high-quality U.S. large cap value companies that pay high dividends consistently and have raised their dividends historically. For comparison purposes the composite is measured against the S&P 500[®] Index and Russell 1000[®] Value Index. The S&P 500[®] Index is an index that measures the performance of 500 publicly traded companies, which are among the largest in the United States. As of January, 2018, it is also measured against the Russell 1000 Value[®] Index, an index which measures the performance of the companies in the Russell 1000[®] Index with lower price-to-book ratios and lower forecasted growth values. The Russell 1000 Value[®] Index was added as a benchmark as it reflects the investment style of the strategy. The minimum account size for this composite is \$100,000.

Matrix Asset Advisors, Inc. claims compliance with the Global Investment Performance Standards (GIPS[®]) and has prepared and presented this report in compliance with the GIPS standards. Matrix Asset Advisors, Inc. has been independently verified for the periods 1/1/92 through 12/31/20. Verification assesses whether (1) the firm has complied with all the composite construction requirements of the GIPS standards on a firm-wide basis and (2) the firm's policies and procedures are designed to calculate and present performance in compliance with the GIPS standards. The Dividend Income Composite has been examined for the periods January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2020. The verification and performance examination reports are available upon request. Matrix Asset Advisors, Inc. is a registered investment adviser that manages equity and fixed income assets for client accounts. The firm's list of composite descriptions is available upon request.

Results are based on fully discretionary accounts under management. Since inception, the composite policy requires the temporary removal of any portfolio incurring a client initiated significant cash inflow or outflow of 15% or greater of portfolio assets. Past performance is not indicative of future results. Returns are presented gross and net of management fees and include the reinvestment of all income. Net of fee performance was calculated using the highest management fee of 0.65%, as per our fee schedule and applied quarterly. The annual composite dispersion presented is an asset-weighted standard deviation calculated for the accounts in the composite the entire year. Additional information regarding the policies for valuing portfolios, calculating performance, and preparing compliant presentations are available upon request. The management fee schedule is as follows: 0.65% on the first \$5,000,000 of assets under management, 0.55% on the next \$5,000,000 of assets under management, 0.50% on the next \$15,000,000 of assets under management, 0.45% on the next \$25,000,000 of assets under management, 0.35% on the next \$50,000,000 of assets under management and 0.30% on assets under management in excess of \$100,000,000. Price to Earnings Ratio also called the P/E ratio, tells investors how much a company is worth. The P/E ratio simply the stock price divided by the company's earnings per share for a designated period like the past 12 months. The price/earnings ratio conveys how much investors will pay per share for \$1 of earnings.

Dividend Yield is a financial ratio that tells you the percentage of a company's share price that it pays out in dividends each year.

Annualized Returns - an annualized rate of return is calculated as the equivalent annual return an investor receives over a given period. The Global Investment Performance Standards dictate that returns of portfolios or composites for periods of less than one year may not be annualized. This prevents "projected" performance in the remainder of the year from occurring.

Market Capitalization Weighted is average market capitalization is a type of market index in which each component is weighted according to the size of its total market capitalization. Market capitalization is the sum of the total value of a company's outstanding shares multiplied by the price of one share.

Market Capitalization Median - The midpoint of market capitalization (market price multiplied by the number of shares outstanding) of the stocks in a portfolio. Half the stocks in the portfolio will have higher market capitalizations; half will have lower.
